The NCETM is pleased to note that the report confirms England's continued strength in mathematics, with pupils in Year 5 and Year 9 performing significantly above the international average.

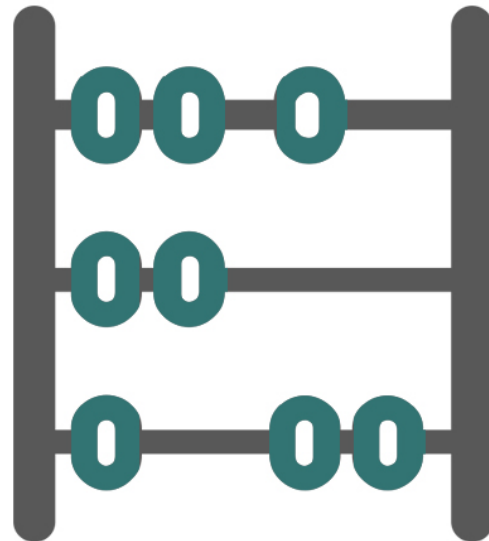
